III. Reading (3% for each)

(A) *The Origin of Species*, written by Charles Darwin and published in 1859, is considered the most significant scientific achievement of the Victorian era. Darwin's theories of natural selection and evolution gave people a different view of how things became the way they were. His ideas varied significantly from most people's beliefs at that time, but Darwin's book was as popular as it was controversial. The first printing sold out almost as soon as it was published.

At that time, the Church of England played an important role in Victorian society. Darwin was able to explain how plants, animals and people evolve without any assistance from God. He was essentially challenging the Church's long-held assertion that God and God alone was responsible for the creation of man, the natural world and everything in it.

Despite much criticism, Darwin continued with his work and never renounced his theories and principles. His work has been vital in leading us to understand who we are and how we got to be the way we are today. Nearly 150 years after *The Origin of Species* was published, scientists still regard almost all of Darwin's findings as accurate.
