Part One: (60%)

Please answer THREE out of the following questions and write each answer from 100 to 120 words: (20% for each answer)

- 1. Please discuss briefly the development of English literature in general from Old English Period to Romantic Period in terms of the "spirit of age."
- 2. Discuss briefly how the religious elements are used in *Beowulf* as an Old English epic.
- 3. Discuss briefly the content of Geoffrey Chaucer's *The Canterbury Tales* in terms of the "pilgrims" and "pilgrimage" as the key concepts for Chaucer to write the poem.
- 4. Discuss the structure of Shakespearean sonnets in terms of the "riming schemes" used by Shakespeare in discussing the "theme" in each sonnet by him.
- 5. Discuss the possible connection between Thomas More's *Utopia* and the so-called Utopian Literature in the western world.
- 6. 'As John Donne and some other writers are called "Metaphysical poets" in English literature, please discuss the features of the poems by them briefly.
- 7. Discuss the possible connection(s) between the Bible and John Milton's *Paradise Lost* in terms of the "argument" Milton asserts, namely "to justify the ways of God to men."
- 8. Discuss the possible connection(s) between the Bible and William Blake's poems.

- 1. Name any specific literary work in which the mixtures of both Christian and Greek/Roman elements are there as the specific feature in it and discuss the possible function of the feature in it.
- 2. Name any writer you like the best by discussing the important contributions and the specific feature(s) of the writing techniques/skills of the writer, that influences the later writers.
- 3. Name any two writers who can be a precursor versus successor to each other in terms of any specific connection between them.
