Traditional Hutong life is dying out in Beijing. The number of Hutong style houses has fallen dramatically in the past few decades as modern office blocks and new and wider roads to cope with Beijing's massive increase in traffic have replaced old areas of traditional housing.

A hundred years ago around 90 percent of ordinary Beijingers lived in Hutong style houses but this is been pared back to just a few small areas in the more traditional parts of the capital such as Yonghegong, with its famous temple.

Many Beijingers now often say that the city is no longer the one they were familiar with. Many of the hutongs, which housed communities of close-knit families for many generations, have been flattened and the space used to build department stores, metro stations, and commercial and financial properties.

An official with the Beijing Municipal Office admitted that hutongs are disappearing, but added that there will be no space in the city for building new skyscrapers and modern facilities if such oldfashioned buildings are not demolished.
