Still, some people believe a hypnotist can control your mind after you've woken up. If you're worried about this, it's probably not for you. If you're not, it could help you with something that has been troubling you.

(2) As more and more people have become concerned about protecting the environment, businesses have started to look for ways to provide sustainable packaging for their products. However, there are many challenges in finding materials that are truly sustainable and that can make a positive difference for the environment.

Supporters of sustainable packaging want companies to use materials and methods that are completely friendly to the environment. For example, some businesses now use recyclable paper packaging materials that can then be recycled again. Wal-Mart, one of the world's largest companies, has begun grading its suppliers on their use of sustainable packaging. The store might even begin to pay more for products that **meet** its guidelines.

However, some environmentalists worry that the movement towards sustainable packaging does not go far enough. In addition to recycled products, supporters of sustainable packaging would like companies to choose materials that are made with the use of renewable energy sources. Many critics have complained about the new plastic water bottle used by Poland Spring. Although the bottle is made with 30 percent less plastic than normal, it still takes great amounts of energy to make the plastic itself. Instead, environmentalists encourage people to drink tap water, which is free, widely available, and requires no packaging.

The movement towards completely sustainable packaging is still new, and it holds the promise of many innovative developments. As consumers become more concerned about protecting the earth's natural resources, companies should work harder to develop packaging that has little or no negative environmental impact.
