The most fundamental classification that has resulted from research on memory is University of Toronto psychologist Endel Tulving's distinction between episodic memory and semantic or categorical memory. The first type comprises memories for particular experiences, such as a view of the Grand Canyon at sunset or a bout of seasickness. In instances of this sort, one's impression is that memory constitutes an image, albeit somewhat faded and fragmented, of the original experience, and research essentially confirms this impression. An individual's collection of episodic memories is of importance in laying the foundation for his ability to recognize the almost innumerable scenes, objects, and people that he has encountered in the past. On the other hand, these memories are relatively unorganized: the constituent elements cannot be called up readily and systematically on command as can, for example, the words in one's vocabulary.

Semantic memory, including memory not only for words but for concepts, rules, and abstract ideas, is guite different from episodic memory. When called upon to use the word "red," one does not remember the particular circumstances in which this word was first encountered or previously used, but rather one recalls the meaning of the word. In order to solve a problem, to read a newspaper, or even to carry on a conversation, one must be able to summon up many semantic or categorical memories at an extremely high speed. It does not suffice to recognize a printed word as a familiar object. One must recall a meaning and relate it to what has gone before in the sentence-all in a tiny fraction of a second. This kind of performance is possible only because semantic or categorical memories are organized into a system that permits efficient retrieval.

John Dewey is given too much credit by some and too much blame by others for the rise of progressive education which is an application in schools of the principles of liberty, equality, and fraternity. Progressive education means freedom to grow naturally, freedom from arbitrary control, and free access to surroundings that will stimulate investigation and construction. It means equality of educational opportunity. Dewey was the great leader of the movement, but the conditions of the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries made the movement inevitable. Some of these conditions were the interpretations of Rousseau by Pestalozzi and Froebel; the kindergarten, the rise of child psychology and the scientific method, the stimulating thought of William James, G. Stanley Hall, and Francis W. Parker, the new elementary school with a broader curriculum and milder discipline; and the growing desires and influences of the common man. Dewey was the most active and ablest leader, but if he had not appeared there would have been others. There were indeed others, but they were overshadowed by Dewey.

Dewey believed that education should be a process of discovery, not one of instruction and drill. His opponents say children in progressive schools do not gain sufficient command of the fundamentals for further progress. Such schools they say are not really progressive. Dewey would have the school be a self-governing society, a democracy, that by actual practice prepares children for democracy in later life. Opponents want discipline, control by the teacher. They say progressive schools are noisy and disorderly. Some of them claim that the United States is not a democracy; it is a republic. Dewey bases his program on the children's interests. Extreme progressives would allow the child's interests to direct the entire program of the school. Dewey and moderates generally would have the teacher guide, enlarge, and improve the child's interests, but his interests, not the adult interests of the teacher, are to be supreme. Education is life, not preparation for life; and its purpose is more life through scientific investigation. Only within this context do the humanities find a place in education.
