The peoples who speak Austronesian languages are mainly spread out across the islands of the South Pacific Ocean. 16 roughly 250 million people, the Austronesian-speaking peoples not only share similarities in their languages and appearance, but many also have a tradition of tattooing. 17 the tattoo patterns used in various regions, one can discover that they are connected, providing clues that can guide the island peoples of the Pacific to discover their shared 18 and the origins of their identity.

The Republic of the Marshall Islands, a diplomatic 19 of Taiwan's located in the Pacific Ocean, 20 had a traditional tattooing culture. In the past they used the wingbone of the frigate-bird to make tattooing needles. Tapping the skin with the needle breaks through the epidermis (the outer layer of the skin), 21 pigment to penetrate into the underlying dermis to leave 22 markings. In English this traditional method is 23 "hand-tapping." However, as a result of colonization and the impact of Western religions, this skill disappeared from the Marshall Islands. It was only in 2021 that a young Marshallese woman, Nannu Kabua, who was studying at university in Taiwan, 24 make the acquaintance of the Paiwan tattoo artist Cudjuy Patjidres, and began to study this tradition. She decided that she wanted to 25 tattooing culture in her homeland.

In India, bacteria that cause common infections, such as urinary tract and bloodstream infections, are becoming resistant to <u>26</u> all antibiotics. This resistance is <u>27</u> a combination of factors: uncontrolled <u>28</u> to antibiotics, gaps in infection prevention and control (IPC) practices, and high <u>29</u> of communicable diseases.
